Public Notification of WIC Benefits:

The Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) provides Federal grants to States for supplemental foods, health care referrals, and nutrition education for pregnant, breastfeeding, and nonbreastfeeding postpartum women, and to infants and children up to age five who are found to be at nutritional risk. Foster children up to 5 years of age are also eligible. You must live in the state of Nebraska to receive Nebraska WIC benefits and fall within these income guidelines:
